Forms of Prayer


Salat is a way of remembering and supplication before God.



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Prayer Forms in Islam

All forms of <u>prayer</u> in Islam are essentially designed for the <u>remembrance</u> and worship of God (<u>Allah</u>).

Islam recognises two forms of prayer:

- One is the <u>personal</u>, devotional, and <u>spontaneous</u> type, not bound by any rituals or formulas.
- The other is ritual, (known as Salat) the obligatory prayers often <u>congregational</u>, with specific words and <u>postures</u>, to be offered five times a day: at <u>sunrise</u>, <u>midday</u>, <u>mid-afternoon</u>, <u>sunset</u>, and before going to bed.


<u>Salat</u> must always be preceded by ablutions (<u>wudu</u>') of ritually washing the face, hands and feet.

At the <u>five</u> appointed times, a <u>muezzin</u> announces a call to prayer (<u>adhan</u>), traditionally from a mosque's <u>minaret</u>. Today, the muezzin is usually heard on the radio or people sometimes use a service such as the "salat pager," which sends a reminder to the believer's pager as prayer times approach.

Islamic prayer begins in a standing position and moves through several simple postures until the supplicant is kneeling.














The content of prayer is glorification of God, recitations of the Qur'an, and blessings on the Prophet. Salat concludes with the taslima (greeting),

"Peace be upon you," even when praying alone.






