Black death		the practice among those with power or influence of favouring relatives or friends, especially by giving them jobs.
Concubinage		the bread and wine are changed into the actual body and blood of Christ in the Eucharist.
Pluralism		morally corrupt; wicked.
Nepotism		the Pope, by reason of his office as Vicar of Christ, the visible source and foundation of the unity both of the bishops and of the whole company of the faithful, and as pastor of the entire Catholic Church, has full, supreme and universal power over the whole Church.
Feudal system		a woman who lives with a man but has lower status than his wife or wives.
Sola scripture		the holding of two or more offices or positions (such as benefices) at the same time.
Transubstantiation		a form of bubonic plague that spread over Europe in the 14th Century and killed an estimated quarter of the population.
Supremacy of the Pope		a religious ceremony or ritual regarded as imparting divine grace, such as Baptism, the Eucharist.
Salvation		scripture alone was the supreme authority over the church.
Sacrament		a social system in the Middle Ages, based on the holding of lands in fief or fee and on the resulting relations between lord and vassal.
Indulgences		a member or follower of any of the Western Christian Churches that are separate from the Roman Catholic Church in accordance with the principles of the Reformation.
Predestined		deliverance from sin and its consequences, brought about by faith in Christ.
Depraved		the bread and wine co-exists with the body and blood of Christ in the Eucharist.
Consubstantiation		of an outcome or course of events determined in advance by divine will or fate.
Protestant		the practice of keeping a concubine, or the state of being a concubine.
Concubine		the remission of the temporal punishment for sins.
