



Complete the timeline of the main events leading up to, and including, the world of the New Testament.



## Solutions to Worksheet SJ-NT9: World of the New Testament

'c' standing for circa - exact date not known, usually referring to a year. Used widely in historical writings when dates and events are approximately known.

BCE - 'Before the Common Era'. The word "common" simply means that it is based on the most frequently used calendar system: the Gregorian Calendar.

CE - 'Common Era'

## Teachers Note:

The division between BC/BCE and AD/CE is not based on religious considerations.

BC and AD do have a religious significance because they state that Yeshua of Nazareth is both God and Messiah: AD means "Year of the Lord." BC means "Before Christ" or "Before the Messiah."

The use of CE and BCE tends to be more attractive to many people -- particularly secularists, non-Christians and liberal Christians. CE and BCE are notations that are not based on religion or myth; they can be embraced by all.
