
## **Scripture and Tradition**

What is your understanding of the term "Tradition"? Find several definitions from different sources.




The word tradition literally means that which has been "handed over" or "passed on".

Read the following references. Write words that suggest the notion of tradition.





Today the primary theological sense of tradition is the community's shared experience of the Lord through faith.

The second sense of tradition is the handing on – in different ways – of that faith experience.

This tradition is expressed in two forms:



Therefore "tradition" helps a community to grow and assimilate new experiences in a way which preserves fundamental integrity and identity.

**Sacred Scripture** is the living tradition of the community or Church coming to written expression.

Those books which the early Christian community deemed as authentic expressions of its faith became part of its official canon of sacred writings, which remain the expression of the faith of the Apostolic Church.
